

General Class:

ECARA is excited to announce our first ever (or in a really long time) General license class!! This has been many years in the making with a lot of push from Al K1AGL. :) This is the second level of Ham Radio license and gives you privileges on all the HF bands (if you haven't gotten the first, let me know that you are interested and I'll follow up with you on that). The class itself is free but the study material will cost around \$25 (we'll be ordering in bulk, more to follow for those that register). The class will be held at the <u>Barnstormers Contest Group</u> in East Killingly and starts on January 14th.

Yeasu FTR60r Review: By KA1MPG

The Yeasu FT-60R is a dual band handheld FM transceiver. This radio operates on 2 meters and 440 MHz. The output power on both bands is 5 watts with the supplied battery. This radio is compact and it is also rugged.

Yeasu made the FT-60R easy to program. I was able to program memories for regular repeater operation without consulting the manual. After briefly consulting the manual I was able to program in CTCSS frequencies and non standard repeater offsets. Yeasu does offer easy to use software and a USB cable for \$40 so you can use a computer to program the memories.



Even though the radio is easy to program it has 1,000 memories. The cable and software will speed up the process.

The display, keypad, and knobs on the FT-60R are just the right size despite the radio's compact size. The FT-60R comes equipped with a 1400 mAh NiMH battery which lasts a long time. You should have no trouble operating a lengthy public service event with one battery. If you want to purchase additional batteries they sell for \$36. The receive audio and transmit audio are excellent. I have only one complaint about the radio and it is a small one. The radio has an SMA antenna connector instead of a BNC connector. You can purchase an SMA to BNC adapter for \$9.

For the price the Yeasu FT-60R is packed with so many features. The most impressive feature is 1000 memory channels. Few handhelds have that many memories. The memories are arranged into banks of 100 and you can store offsets and CTCSS frequencies along with names for memory channels. There are many different scanning modes and 50 pairs of memories just to define frequency ranges you want to scan. The FT-60R has an extended receive frequency range. It can receive from 108 MHz to 520 MHz and 700 MHz to 999MHz. There are so many other features such as the ability to program the radio to receive only if a given CTSCC frequency is used and an emergency beacon feature.


The Yeasu FT-60R sells for \$149. Considering the features, performance, and quality of this radio it is well worth the money.

DMR Presentation Overview:

DMR (Digital Mobile Radio) is based on a worldwide digital standard just like Packet and RTTY/PSK. The standard was developed by radio users and manufacturers. It can transport (carry) voice and low speed data. Amateur use of DMR was slow to catch on as the only available commercial radios were very expensive (for us hams). In the last year a company called Connect Systems, Inc. started importing a DMR radio for under \$200. We hams, being dollar frugal, jumped on the chance to experience a new mode for a lesser price than the expensive commercial radios. Sort of like the cheap Chinese hand-helds most of us use now. Fifty dollars for a hand held radio was unheard of just a few years ago. Yes, they work. Yes, they have helped new hams get on the air. So the CSI CS-700 has done the same to Digital Mobile Radio. Now there is an explosion of DMR repeaters and users.

At this presentation I hope to show ECARA attendees how other Connecticut clubs have jumped at the chance to install DMR repeaters for their club use. I'll go into the history behind Connecticut's entry into DMR and how we adjusted the rules to help emergency communications in this state, plus a whole lot of techie stuff just to possibly bore you. DMR can be thought of linked repeaters on Steroids. CU Monday, 12 January, at the regular ECARA meeting.

This year, W1EQ was unable to be the third Musketeer so Dave, N3XF, and I went alone. Dave is ex-WA1DWE originally from Danielson but now lives in western PA (we went to Killingly High School together in our much younger years). We flew down to play in the ARRL 10M contest. This is a very fun contest. There are lots of hams on St. Croix and we are members of the radio club there, too (see

above pix).

The house I rent has a 30ft crank up tower with a 3 element beam on top. We also put up a Hexxbeam to include 17M and 12M for playing during the week. The house also has 3 bedrooms, 3 baths, and a salt water pool for creature comfort.



Average temp during our stay was 85deg...every day, and just a 10deg cooler at night. Above pix is of the hexx-beam. It has 5 bands in one antenna (20M thru 10M with 17m and 12m, too).

We did quite well in the low power category. Just the radio. No additional amplifiers. We made almost 2400 QSOs (contacts) and both of us got a good night's sleep as the 10M band died at night. We operated 2 hour shifts during the contest with the off operator spending time in the pool. Certainly not Field Day conditions.

It is always fun to hook up with the local hams while on island and they are all very helpful. All are involved with USVI emergency management as they are the communicators during hurricanes; just like ECARA supports Connecticut Amateur Radio Emergency Services (ARES).

Always a fun trip. Wives and/or girlfriends spend the weekend at the beach while the guys play radio contest.
