

Secretary's Report:

Motion made to accept April minutes as published in the May SinePost; seconded and carried.

Treasure's Report:

Beginning Balance: \$9262.99; Deposits – none; Expenses – digital repeater \$1810.00; Ending Balance: \$7452.99. Motion made to accept the April Treasurer's Report; seconded and carried.

Old Business:

• Discussion on, and status of equipment on South Killingly (SK) tower site. It was proposed that the simplex packet radio be left in service and that the packet repeater be "recrystalled" (change of frequency) as a backup to the K1MUJ repeater. The cost for the re-crystalling is \$100.

The repeater would then be added to the existing combiner. Motion made to authorize \$100 for the re-crystalling, seconded and carried.

- Name badges were made available at the meeting for those members needing to claim. Unclaimed badges will be mailed after field day in June. Ctc: KB1DNO
- The Jog w/Judy event on May 2nd went very well. A sufficient number of operators were available for all posts. Ctc: KB1JDX
- Last month it was proposed that some token of appreciation be given to NDDH for frequently allowing the club to use their convenient facility for license classes and licensing examinations. KB1JDX discussed with NDDH and learned that a class on setting up the radios (go kits) would be beneficial. Also, it was proposed by club membership a permanent antenna be installed on the building; a brief discussion ensued. KB1JDX to further investigate. Ctc: KB1JDX

New Business:

- K1AGL provided and demonstrated new field day signs for the event.
- Nothing heard from the Rail to Trail event. KE1LI to follow up.
- A reminder that Sky Warn training is at Ashford Town Hall 7-10PM tomorrow.
- Reminder that the Woodstock 10K Road Race is on Mon., 25 May (Memorial Day). Meet at the commons at 8:30AM, or on the net same time. Ctc: KE1LI
- Angel Ride secured permission to use the K1MUJ repeater for the event on Sun., 24 May.
- Discussion on public service announcements (PSA). The ARRL has PSAs for field day, K1AGL played one for the meeting to hear. Discussion followed about customizing for ECARA, forwarding to WINY, posting on the club web site, and adding to the SinePost. A motion made to implement the above, seconded and carried. Ctc: K1AGL
- KA1MPG gave an update on plans for this year's field day event at the Allen Hill Tree Farm. Set-up will be on Friday, 26 Jun at 2PM. Potluck dinner will be on Sat., 27 Jun at 6PM. He will be writing and article for publicity, and give to W1EQ for publishing.
 Also, invitations to selected public officials will be generated. KZ1M will be used for the field day call sign, and K1MUJ for the GOTA kit. Please let him know what food is being brought to the dinner. The requisite porta-potty was discussed. A motion was made to authorize KE1LI an NTE amount of \$150 to order, seconded and carried. Ctc: KA1MPG
- A motion was made to authorize up to \$20 for office supplies needed by club secretary, seconded and carried.
- K1DVM, John voted in as new member. Welcome aboard, John!!!

Good of the order: none Meeting adjourned at 1950hrs.

What is Field Day? By KA1MPG



Amateur Radio has proven time and again it is the only form of communication that is truly reliable whenever there is a major disaster such as a hurricane or earthquake. Emergency communications and ham radio are nearly synonymous. To become proficient in emergency communications takes practice.

That is what field day is all about. Every year approximately 30,000 Ham Radio operators gather at remote field day locations across the country to simulate conditions encountered after a major disaster. They practice their emergency communications skills and test their equipment

under adverse conditions. At each remote location ham radio clubs setup complete stations where no facilities exist and power them using emergency power. These stations include radios, antennas, computers, and coax cables. Each station needs some sort of shelter such as a tent or a trailer. Some clubs setup as many as



twenty stations. The ECARA will set five or six stations this year.



To make things more interesting for everyone field day is a contest. Each station tries to work as many other stations as possible during a 24 hour period while exchanging information with them. During emergencies ham operators very often radio relay information for different disaster agencies, usually under a great deal of pressure, and under adverse conditions. The contest portion of field day simulates this relaying of information.

Field day has become a huge social event for ham radio clubs. More than twenty people usually attend ECARA field day each year. They gather, socialize, and have fun when they are not operating. Some spend the entire 24 hours at the field day site but most spend a few hours. I have made many close friendships during field days.

Saturday evening during field day there is always a potluck supper at 6 PM. If you would like to bring a dish or a dessert item please do so. The club always purchases hamburgers, hotdogs, and soda for those that attend. Every year I brew a batch of beer and share it with everyone. This year I made an American Cream Ale which will be perfect for warm summer weather.



The Eastern Connecticut Amateur Radio Association is of in need relief always operators. We try to keep all of the stations running for as much of the 24 hours as possible. If you can only operate for an hour or two that would be a big help. We will need help with setup which begins at 2 PM Friday June 26th.

If you have never operated before, field day is the perfect opportunity to do so. We will be running a "Get on the Air" station just for hams who have never operated. If you would like to improve your contesting and emergency communications skills there are plenty of experienced hams who will be more than willing to help you.

The ECARA is setting up field day at the Allen Hill Farm at 542 Allen Hill Road in Brooklyn, Connecticut. The contest begins 2 PM Saturday June 27th and runs for 24 hours.

Woodstock Memorial Day Road Race

On May, 25th, Memorial Day, ECARA was once again asked to assist in the 35th running of the Woodstock Memorial Day Road race.

The route takes runners through the pastoral vistas of Woodstock only to end the last mile of this 10K race with a steep uphill climb on Child Hill Road.

The weather was good for the race with temperatures in the mid 60's at the start. The record field of 220 participants started promptly at 9:05 and the last runner crossed the finish line at 10:30 (ISH).
