Welcome to the November 2024 edition of the *Sinepost*, ECARA's monthly newsletter. I've accepted the position of editor starting with this issue, and I hope you enjoy reading it. We would like to thank Jon Fournier KA1MPG, for several years of service editing and distributing the *Sinepost*, and for his efforts helping to coordinate the ECARA Field Day activities, hamfests and other work he has performed for the club. We also wish he and his family, Ron KA1MPI, and Margaret N1NNP, the best with their recent concerns.

All members are strongly encouraged to join the ECARA club email reflector, if you haven't already please sign up at ecara-reflector+subscribe@groups.io (link also on the ECARA web site). Check your email regularly to watch for club news and information. We're also working on setting a Discord server for the club; in the meantime you might want to get familiar with Discord at discord.com and install their app on your smartphone.

The club will be offering free Amateur Radio training classes including FCC license preparation starting in February 2025, please spread the word far and wide! We'll be making printed flyers available for you to help distribute wherever you work, shop, attend school, or anywhere else you go.

There are plans to hold another Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training course in 2025. Last year several ECARA members became sworn-in and certified members of the Northeastern CT CERT Team, which is sponsored by FEMA, Emergency Management and the Department of Homeland Security. It's an interesting and worthwhile training course, and all interested citizens are encouraged to participate. We had a great turnout of ECARA members and other local hams for the 2024 training course, CERT and Amateur Radio go hand in hand, and attract a lot of the same service-minded people. About 28 of your neighbors completed the local CERT course in Putnam in 2024 and several have gone on to get their ham radio licenses as well, and some are now new members of ECARA—welcome! CERT has a lot in common with the Amateur Radio community service activity you've probably already been a part of, with additional indepth training in basic first aid, search and rescue, traffic, emergency protocols and organization, and more. Training is free, and the NE CERT Team holds periodical drills and is called in to serve at local events, parades, demonstrations, fairs, exercises and so on. ECARA's John Turner K1JFT, who is with Putnam Emergency Management and is the NE CT CERT team leader, organized the class in 2024; let him know if you're interested in taking part!

Keep in mind that the main purpose of ECARA is participation in Amateur Radio activities. This includes attending our monthly meetings, Field Day every June, checking into the weekly Thursday night nets, helping out at parades, public events, walkathons, marathons, bikeathons, fairs, emergency drills, club picnics and holiday parties, teaching training classes, assisting at hamfests, and any other activity the club offers. None of these are possible if you don't take part. For example, almost everyone in the club is licensed and equipped to operate on 2-meter FM. So take 10 minutes each Thursday evening at 7 to check in to the ECARA Emergency Net on K1MUJ. There's nothing to it, and it helps support the club's readiness capability, and helps show the community and the government that Amateur Radio is active and important. Please try to come to the regular club meeting at the East Putnam Fire Department, the second Monday of the month at 7 PM, we need you to take part in the club's business affairs and we enjoy socializing with our fellow members, this is how many of us became friends! Make sure you come out to Field Day the fourth full weekend of June every year at Gawron Farm in Thompson, we have a great time on and off the air, and great food, too. And there are plenty of other fun and rewarding events. Let's all step up our level of participation as we head into 2025. Maybe we'll even be able to recruit some new members, especially some fresh young blood! Don't sit back and let the same 2 or 3 people run every club event; most of our activities don't require an inordinate amount of effort if several members pitch in, and you can help prevent the people who seem to do everything from getting burned out if you raise your hand and help. Please be an active member, not just a call sign on a roster!

One way you can play an important role is right here in this newsletter. We enthusiastically welcome *Sinepost* article contributions from ECARA members or any other people who have information or ideas of interest to the club or the general Amateur Radio community. Even if you've never tried to write any sort of article in your life, everyone has

Bay State Trail Riders Association (BSTRA) Horse Event

On November 17 ECARA supported the Bay State Trail Riders association with their event at the old Thompson Raceway. This event was a series of trails and loops that totaled between 5 and 8 miles. This was a trail ride for horses, and not a

timed event like a 5k is. They were expecting 20-30 horses, but with the help of the nice weather they ended up getting 72 horses and riders for the event.

This event had a few unique challenges, there was no set start time or numbered bibs that we usually have on similar events. Riders would head out when they wanted and ride the trails in different ways adding loops or turning around mid-trail. Our role was to monitor and report back any safety concerns on the course, especially because this area is popular with dirt bikes. To do this, we tracked different horses by their outfits or their saddle blankets. We had "Orange Ears", "Pink Blanket", and "Hi-Viz Green leg wraps", which made for a more entertaining way to track than standard runner bibs.

We were concerned with the two crossings of East Thompson Rd. Luckily, we had constables and hams posted there, and that allowed all horses to cross successfully. As Net Control I was able to keep count on the number of horses on the far side of East Thompson Road as a way to monitor that they all made it back safely by using the check-ins from the posts. Another concern was vehicles on course since the roads weren't closed. We stationed posts along the other road crossings as well as blind corners to monitor and alert riders and cars or each other.

The event ran from 9 AM until just before 1 PM, there were 10 hams helping out, spread out along the course (including 2 first-time hams), we used the ECARA command trailer for Net Control.

They are a super friendly group (they fed us very well) and were extremely happy with the level of communication and support we were able to provide. This event happens every 6 months with the next event tentatively scheduled for May 18.

Former ARRL New England Division Director Tom Frenaye K1KI addressed the club for about an hour on his candidacy for ARRL New England Division Director.

Ed K1ZE spoke in support of the incumbent Fred Kemmer AB1OC, who is running for reelection.

The Secretary's report for July as posted in the Sinepost was accepted.

The Treasurer reported that August's beginning balance was \$5,957.08.

Since then we have received a \$300 donation from Brian AC1NN for the liability insurance, dues of \$71.67, and \$600 from the sale of donated equipment from one of our SKs, for a total of \$971.67.

We spent 19.68 for excise tax on the trailer, \$30 for connectors, \$50 for legal filing for the State of CT, \$200 for two gift cards for our Field Day hosts, \$300 for liability insurance, \$72 for our PO box rental, and \$111.64 for copying - for total expenses of 4783.32.

Our ending balance is \$6,145.43.

This report was accepted.

We discussed the latest proposed revisions to our bylaws, at which time some members questioned the text of the new proposed bylaws, and others whether they were needed, at which point Brian AC1NN resigned his membership and office as president and left the meeting.

Ron N1LSJ took over running the meeting at 8:30 as the highest-ranking officer in attendance. We will elect a new interim President at the next meeting.

We discussed a new Technician license training class to start the first Wednesday in February.

The Amateur Radio Simulated Emergency Test (SET) is Saturday, October 26, at 9:30 AM on the K1MUJ repeater. Please check in. There may be deployments to EOCs etc.
